

Changes in DHS90548

1. CPR after 90 days, not 180; only staff who may have contact with persons served
2. Defines provider QA process
3. Requires DHS and DSPD code of conduct
4. Requires providers with governing boards to maintain and disclose minutes of their Board meeting.
5. BCx – Requires the completion of a functional behavioral assessment as part of the development of the BSP and requires a SOLE provider of all BC services unless this requirement is waived by the Assoc Director, DSPD.
6. COM allows *incidental* transportation to meet the needs of the person (i.e. picking up prescriptions) but does NOT allow transportation of persons served (insurance requirements).
7. DSG is a worksheet rate that determines a daily rate only, based on an hourly rate which is determined by staffing ratios. But ONLY the daily rate is offered. If using 1:1 staff/client ratios, must be for a SINGLE person and involve UNINTERRUPTED auditory and visual surveillance at all times. Must demonstrate that contractor has investigated and ruled out the use of technology.
8. DSP is now a worksheet rate; up to 6 hours/day except during times of extended school closure (more than 5 days of no school) in which case its available for 10 hrs/day. MUST be operational for at 4 hours/day, except if waived by the Assoc Director, DSPD. May NOT be used with either DSI or DSG on the same

- day. Intended as an AFTERSCHOOL program. May be used as an alternative to RPS during summer months. MTP is available if no other transportation exists.
9. ELS staff may now be 18 even in PPS/HHS homes. If using 1:1 staff/client ratios, must be for a SINGLE person and involve UNINTERRUPTED auditory and visual surveillance at all times. Must demonstrate that contractor has investigated and ruled out the use of technology.
 10. HHS staff may be 18 years (parents MUST be 21). May mix HHS and PPS in PPS homes. HHS parents may NOT be rep payees for the persons they serve (contractors can).
 11. PPS staff may be 18 (PPS parents must be 21). May mix HHS and PPS in PPS homes. PPS parents may NOT be rep payees for the kids they serve (contractors can).
 12. PBA is a session rate for those receiving RHS/HHS/PPS. One session every two weeks. For all others, PBA is an hourly rate determined by the plan.
 13. PM1/PM2 is now a session rate. Number and frequency of sessions is determined by the plan. NO parenteral meds support. NO daily rate.
 14. RHS- If using 1:1 staff/client ratios, must be for a SINGLE person and involve UNINTERRUPTED auditory and visual surveillance at all times. Must demonstrate that contractor has investigated and ruled out the use of technology.
 15. RPS IS available to State custody kids.

16. SLH/SLN not available to State custody kids,
Contractors+ only responsible for on-site time.
